Purpose of Program

- To be an ambassador for your Indiana University
- To provide honest and helpful information and answer questions students have about IU
- To help students determine if Indiana University Bloomington is the right fit for them
- To keep up-to-date with what is going on at Indiana University and in Bloomington

Step 1: Contacting the School

- Please contact your adopted school by using the contact information we provided by the end of September
 - Contact via email or phone
 - Arrange a meeting to introduce yourself if possible
 - If a director from IU travels to your school, (s)he will contact you to see if you can accompany him/her on the visit
 - Introduce yourself as a local resource available to prospective students that have questions about Indiana University
 - Provide your preferred contact information for prospective students to contact you if they have questions

Step 2: Contacting Admitted Students

- We will provide you with data on admitted students throughout the year.
 - Call or email these students to congratulate them on their acceptance, and offer to answer any questions they may have (suggested script and email to come)
 - Offer to meet them (and their parents) to discuss attending Indiana University

Step 3: Communicate With Us

- Be sure to notify us if a student informs you that they decide to attend IU or if they decide to attend another University.
- If you have any questions that you are unable to answer, don't hesitate to ask us yourself or ask us to contact the student.

Please Remember...

- That you are a resource for students as they make their decision. We are not asking you to assess a students' admissibility.
- This is a great way for you to show your passion for your alma mater.
- To be respectful of other institutions the student may be considering.
- We do not wish to convince students to come to IU, but rather help guide them through the decision-making process.
- Your communication can help students decide whether or not they will attend Indiana University!

Admissions Info: Freshman Priority Dates

November 1	Submit a <u>complete</u> application for admission to receive priority consideration for merit-based scholarships
February 1	Priority date for admission consideration; file the FAFSA before March 1 for priority consideration for need-based aid
April 1	Applications received after April 1 will be reviewed on a space-available basis
May 1	National Candidates reply date

Freshman Admission Standards

- Academic Profile:
 - Preparation
 - IU looks at the courses you took to prepare yourself for college. We like to see an average of 18-20 year-long academic courses, including English, math, social science, lab science and foreign language.
 - Grades
 - The average GPA of students admitted for Fall 2009 was a 3.6 (on a 4.0 scale)
 - Grade Trends
 - Test Scores
 - Middle 50% SAT for Fall 2009 was a 1100-1290 (CR and M only)
 - Middle 50% ACT for Fall 2009 was a 24-28 composite
 - Class Rank

Student Population

- 31,626 undergraduates (2008-2009)
- 8,728 graduate/professional students (2007-2008)
- Total school enrolment: Just under 39,000 (2007-2008)
- We have students from all 50 states and more than 125 different countries
- More than 4,000 international students study at IU
- 2009-2010 Freshman class:
 - 7,327 students
 - 64% Indiana residents
 - 50.3% female
 - 49.7% male
 - 77% in top quarter of high school class
 - 12% students of color (African American, Asian American, Latino, American Indian)
 - 5% international students

Academics

- 183 undergraduate majors
- 332 degree programs
- 13 undergraduate schools
- 35 – average class size
- 18:1 student:faculty ratio
- 4,000 course offered each semester
- More than 100 faculty members have been named to prestigious academic societies
- College of Arts and Sciences – offers more than 80 foreign languages
- Over 2,000 hiring organizations actively recruit IU students for full- and part-time positions through our career services offices.

Campus Involvement

- More than 650 clubs and organizations
- Over 60 fraternities and sororities
- Approximately 18% of students are active in the Greek system (more than 5,000 students)
- More than 1,100 musical and theatrical productions each year
- More than 20 intramural sports
- Over 40 club sports and 20 intramural sports
- 24 varsity sports (13 for women, 11 for men), creating more than 180 home events to cheer at each year
- More than 90 group exercise and mind-body sessions offered each week through Student Recreational Sports Center (SRSC)

Automatic Academic Scholarships

- **IU Excellence – in-state** **\$9,000 per year**
SAT 1330 or above or ACT 30 or above & minimum GPA of 3.8
- **IU Distinction – out-of-state** **\$9,000 per year**
SAT 1330 or above or ACT 30 or above & minimum GPA of 3.8
- **IU Prestige** **\$5,000 per year**
SAT 1260 or above or ACT 28 or above & minimum GPA of 3.8
- **IU Recognition** **\$2,000 per year**
SAT 1170 or above or ACT 26 or above & minimum GPA of 3.7

SAT score is based on Critical Reading and Math sections only;

ACT score considered is the Composite Score
