

Indiana University Alumni Association Constituent Societies Grant Program and Application 2009-10

Purpose:

The Indiana University Alumni Association is requesting \$6,000* in funding for IUAA Constituent Societies to facilitate the development of new or innovative programming that will help strengthen the network of relationships among constituent societies and their students, alumni, and friends. The grant is open to all Constituent Societies regardless of size. These funds are intended to assist constituent society efforts to connect alumni, serve IU, provide services to members, and to support the strategic plans of the IUAA and IU.

IUAA Constituent Societies are allowed to submit grant proposals for new, innovative programs that will take place between July 1, 2009 and June 30, 2010. Innovative programs would encompass such areas as:

- One-time special events (school/campus anniversary, etc.);
- New programs (lifelong learning, student programming, membership initiatives, etc.);
- Publications (printed);
- Communications (electronic); and
- Service projects benefiting the school/campus (legislative mission, scholarship programs, athletics, etc.).

Evaluation Criteria:

The Constituent Society must complete and submit an IUAA Constituent Society Grant Application. Only completed applications will be considered for funding. The grant will fund an innovative program that occurs between July 1, 2009 and June 30, 2010. Applications received by June 30 will receive priority funding consideration.

The completed application will be reviewed by a committee appointed by the IUAA president and CEO. Applications will be judged on a 100-point scale with the following information:

1. Describe your program clearly and concisely. Your description should include the name, purpose of the program, dates, location, target audience, new or repeated program, length of program, and is this program a collaborative effort. (15 points)
2. Describe the proposed program budget with associated marketing expenses. Describe how the grant funds will assist the overall program budget. (10 points)
3. Attach your sponsorship solicitation packet and describe how you will take the steps to secure the additional money needed for funding the event. If the major capital of the program is over \$5,000, then half of the amount of the money must be raised before applying for this grant. (10 points)

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4. General description of activity and how it benefits the Constituent Society or the school through alumni engagement.
 - A. Increase event attendance on alumni participation (5 points)
 - B. Generate press coverage (10 points)
 - C. Draw more alumni and reconnect them to IU (10 points)
5. How the proposed program fits into the mission of IUAA and IU. (20 points)
6. Applications must be submitted at least 90 days prior to the program, unless other circumstances warrant less notification.
 - A. Up to an additional 20 points will be awarded for applications including completeness, details, marketing plan, budget, quality of program, etc. (20 points)

Award Process:

A committee will be appointed by the president and CEO of the IU Alumni Association.

1. Programs must take place between July 1, 2009 and June 30, 2010. Applications will be accepted at any time beginning March 1, 2009, and those applications received by June 30, 2009 will have the best chance of receiving funding. However, we will accept applications until funding is depleted for the current fiscal year ending June 30, 2010.*
2. Applicants will be notified after 45 days of their application submission.
3. Applicants who do not meet the full criteria may receive a partial grant to help with their program expenses.
4. Unless prior arrangements have been made, funding will be dispersed within 30 days following completion of the event, when the results have been reviewed and received to the satisfaction of the grant committee. The results of the program must be recorded in the IUAA Event Tracker within 30 days of the completion of the event or program.
5. Funding is contingent on the event or program reasonably occurring as proposed. The applicant Constituent Society must notify the IUAA as soon as possible if significant changes are expected that would impact the program as proposed.
6. The IUAA may withdraw funding or request the return of funds for programs which are substantially reduced or inaccurately portrayed in the application.
